## SAMA GALA TO CELEBRATE AMERICA

Loretto – Uncle SAMA wants you to come to the Gala. This summer, the Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art at Loretto will celebrate America at its 39<sup>th</sup> annual Gala fundraiser. The "Red, White and Blue" Gala will be held Saturday, July 22 on the campus of Saint Francis University. Glenda Forosisky is chair of this year's event, with Dorothea Nelson honorary chair.

Guests will arrive to a red-carpet welcome along a flag-festooned border. Uncle SAMA himself will be on-hand to greet guests and pose for pictures. Nearby, a World War II-era Jeep will be on display, filled with craft beer packed on ice. Mingling with guests will be members of the Keystone Pinups, a local non-profit group of young women who follow in the footsteps of the World War II "canteen girls."

In the Museum, guests will enjoy a champagne reception along with the featured exhibitions, Labor and Landscape: 100 Paintings of the Allegheny Mountain Region by Ron Donoughe and Fred Staloff: A Selection of Works from the Butler Institute of American Art. As an added salute, there will be an exhibition of flags and uniforms from every branch of the U.S. military, on loan from the Cambria County War Memorial.

The tent will be decorated with the stars and stripes, as well as bunting, beautiful floral arrangements and a Statue of Liberty glowing in the night sky. A M\*A\*S\*H-style sign post will point out the various Museum and Gala locations, such as the silent auction, the casino, and the famous raw bar. For dinner, guests will be treated to gourmet all-American cuisine.

Returning to the Gala this year will be the Flood City Brass Band. Formed in 2002, the 9-piece horn band from Johnstown features two lead vocalists and a dynamite rhythm section. The band has performed at festivals and events throughout the region and was voted Best Band in Johnstown by readers of the *Tribune Democrat*.

The live auction will offer 13 spectacular items, highlighted by a Fred Danziger painting of the *USS John P. Murtha*. SAMA will donate a portion of the proceeds raised by the sale of the painting to Veterans Community Initiative.
