Selection Juror's Statement

A juror serves as the lens through which submissions are focused to form an exhibition. Today that means poring over hundreds of pieces viewed on a computer screen. It is sometimes a challenge to perceive the fullness of real-life works viewed through a screen, good as mine is, since art is inevitably altered by the limitations of pixels or by the photographer's skills. As a juror for this Biennial exhibition at the Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art, I was impressed by the creativity and excellence that I saw in submitted works, screen or no screen.

As anyone would be, I was subject to being swayed by first impressions, but combing through all the submissions several times over, I worked to see beyond my own values and predispositions to find the impetus for each artwork: What was it that the artist felt needed to be shown? And then: How effectively was that impetus realized in this piece? The best, in my eye, were those works whose materials were far from impediments, where the familiarity of the artist with her colors, his medium, their concept, was like a direct extension of the artist's mind, showing us exactly what they wished us to see.

The range of works submitted was of course wide – including paintings, drawings, and photographs; metal, wood, polystyrene, and ceramic sculpture; fiber, computer imagery and appropriated objects – with a commensurate range in styles and skills. I wanted to reflect as much of this variety as I could in the selections, while keeping an eye on the “realization” part of the equation. I sought to give more credence to works that showed intensive involvement in the piece, over those which seem to shine with skill alone – meanwhile keeping in mind that skill itself is a laudable, tangible result of long involvement over time.

Today, we celebrate these creators and their art, as well as those that were not included in this exhibition for various reasons. My goal was to identify the works that were most brilliant in their own right, despite any attempted “pixel sabotage” or partiality. In the end, the Southern Alleghenies Museum of Art is fortunate to have so many talented artists in its reach, and I was honored to be chosen to confirm that in this year's Biennial exhibition.

Thomas Paquette

Meet the Jurors

Thomas Paquette Selection Juror

Thomas Paquette has been a full-time artist for over three decades after finishing his MFA degree in painting in 1988. His paintings have been featured in more than sixty solo exhibitions in museums and prominent galleries in New York City, Chicago, Philadelphia, Minneapolis, Washington, DC, and elsewhere around the country. Paquette graduated summa cum laude with a BFA in painting from Bemidji State University in 1985, and earned an MFA on a full fellowship from Southern Illinois University, Edwardsville. He was awarded a three-year residency-fellowship in Miami Beach through the National Foundation for Advancement in the Arts after finishing his degree. Other artist-residencies include American Academy in Rome, Aegean Arts and Cultural Exchange, Blue Mountain Center, Millay Colony, Vermont Studio Center, and Acadia, Yosemite, and Rocky Mountain national parks.

Solo museum exhibitions were installed at Dubuque Museum of Art, Erie Art Museum, Evansville Museum of Art and Science, Georgia Museum of Art, Minnesota Marine Art Museum, Quick Center for the Arts, The Rockwell Museum, Watermark Art Center, Westmoreland Museum of American Art, and Wildling Art Museum. Forty of his paintings have been selected to hang in nineteen U.S. embassies on five continents, including in the cities of Rome, Brussels (NATO permanent collection), Athens, Vienna, St. Petersburg, Moscow, Taipei, and Santiago. His works are included in numerous private, corporate, museum and state collections, and have been featured in numerous publications. Thomas Paquette lives on the edge of the Allegheny National Forest outside Warren, Pennsylvania.

Awards Jurors

Dr. Pete Skoner

Dean of the School of STEAM, Professor

Dr. Peter Skoner was appointed the founding Dean of the School of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) at Saint Francis University in Loretto, Pennsylvania in 2018. Among the major changes in STEAM since then was the creation of the Center for Fine Arts to promote and highlight academic programs and opportunities for individual students to participate in the performing and visual arts. Dr. Skoner has served on accreditation and certification visiting evaluation teams for the Middle States Commission on Higher Education, National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA Division I), and Pennsylvania Department of Education. Before his academic career, he was a mining engineer with Bethlehem Mines Corporation, a research fellow with the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), and a research observer with the Pittsburgh Public School System. He received his B.S. degree in mining engineering from the Pennsylvania State University, M.Ed. from Saint Francis College, and M.B.A. and Ed.D. from the Indiana University of Pennsylvania. He is also a Registered Professional Engineer in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Jessica Campbell pursued her arts education at Seton Hill University, where she graduated with a B.F.A. in 3-D media. 
Julie Hart
